

Overview of the Asia-Pacific Telecommunity (APT) (Reference 1)

- The APT (Asia-Pacific Telecommunity) is an intergovernmental organization established in 1979 with the aim of promoting the balanced development of information and communications technology (ICT) in the Asia-Pacific region.
- Japan has been a member of the APT since it was founded and is its largest donor.

1. Purpose

To promoting the balanced development of information and communications technology (ICT) in the Asia-Pacific region by promoting development of human resources through training and seminars (education, projects, etc.), and coordinating regional policies such as telecommunications standardization and frequency allocation.
